May 22 is Trinity Sunday:

There is no other celebration in the Church Year like Trinity Sunday. It always falls on the first Sunday after Pentecost Sunday and is the only major church festival celebrating a doctrine (belief) instead of historical event. It was instituted by Pope Gregory IX in the year 828 CE. Trinity Sunday lifts up the Christian understanding that God is three distinct Persons (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit) in One God. Many historians and scholars



believe the celebration of Trinity Sunday emerged as a way to help correct any heretical (false) teaching. Today we can honor the day by reflecting on how we understand God.

The New and Old Come Together in a Votive Stand

The recent addition of a votive stand to the Bishop Black Chapel came about as a result of the continued effort to enhance the chapel's prayerful atmosphere. However, its story and link to Good Shepherd can represent the belief that something thought to be no longer needed can be given a new use. The lovely votive stand started as one way to create another opportunity for individuals to pause and pray, as the custom of lighting a candle with a prayer has long been a part of many religions, especially Christianity. Many find it a comfort to light a candle, especially in dark times. Those who seek that sort of prayer opportunity can now do so in the Bishop Black Chapel. As with all customs associated with the Episcopal Church, we believe, "All may, some should, none must," which is a way of saying it is there if you want to try, if you are hungry for that kind of opportunity, but you certainly are not required to do so.



This particular votive stand is actually older than it seems. It was created from broken pieces of an old church pew from the Church of the Good Shepherd and the old communion rail, which had been sitting in storage. Our Junior Warden, Ted Foster, had the idea of using the pieces in storage, and he asked Michael Luelloff to design and build the votive stand. The result is beautiful and durable, and it works well in the space it was made for. While it might be said the forgotten pew pieces and communion rail have found a new life, it could also be said they are continuing to be part of what they were originally made for: holders of prayer and light.

You are invited to visit the new votive holder and see it for yourself; perhaps pause and say a prayer while you are there. What other things at Church of the Good Shepherd can you imagine being put to a new use to provide opportunities for prayer, mission, or ministry?

They will be kept in a file cabinet in a locked closet at the church, with only people who have keys to that closet having access to them.

This is not a legal document, and no one is required to complete it all or any particular portion of it. Anyone who elects to fill out a form may add any additional information or documents desired.

Each person who fills out a form will be assigned a folder containing the **form** itself and any other desired documents, such as a **Living Will**, an **Advance Directive**, a **Do-Not-Resuscitate** form.

Participants will be invited to update their information each year.

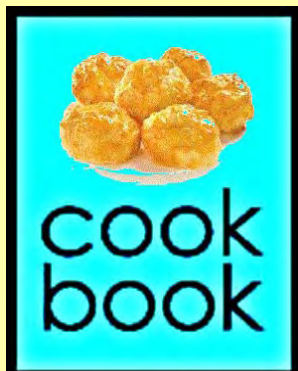
