



Fourth Sunday after the Epiphany

Mark 1:21-28

Jesus and his disciples went to Capernaum; and when the sabbath came, he entered the synagogue and taught. They were astounded at his teaching, for he taught them as one having authority, and not as the scribes. Just then there was in their synagogue a man with an unclean spirit, and he cried out, "What have



you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are, the Holy One of God." But Jesus rebuked him, saying, "Be silent, and come out of him!" And the unclean spirit, convulsing him and crying with a loud voice, came out of him. They were all amazed, and they kept on asking one

another, "What is this? A new teaching-with authority! He commands even the unclean spirits, and they obey him." At once his fame began to spread throughout the surrounding region of Galilee.

From Bondage to Liberation: 2018 Lenten Series

Bishop Thomas E. Breidenthal, along with the Rev. Karl Stevens and Rabbi Daniel Bogard, will lead a Lenten Series, "From Bondage to Liberation," at Christ Church Cathedral on Wednesday evenings beginning February 21. The cathedral, in conjunction with the bishop's staff, is pleased to offer the series to the entire diocese via livestream technology. More information about this exciting learning opportunity is coming soon.

Vestry Meeting Review (Jan. 18 meeting)

Café: On January 5th via The Rev. Jason Leo a final proposal was submitted to Bishop Breidenthal. The Bishop's initial response is "thumbs up." Our parish has also been encouraged apply to Province 5 Campus Ministries; Mother Deborah is in the process of writing the proposal.



Sanctuary Churches: Mother Deborah has not been able to attend the local meetings; she is asking someone else to represent the church to attend these meetings.

Assessment Exercise: This exercise form (completed by vestry members before tonight's meeting) has been used the past three years and submitted to The Rev. Lynn Carter-Edmands. After the assessments were tallied and compared to previous years there seemed good consistency and any variations easily explained. The high overall scores show that Good Shepherd is a vibrant and healthy congregation and seems easily to shift its attention to where it is called to go.

Discernment/Review: The three-year letter of agreement between the vestry and Priest in Charge ends Jan 26th this month. However the renewal process calls for a six-month convoluted review process. The Rev. Jane Gerdsen recommended that we ask The Rev. Jason Leo to help with and shorten the process (we were given a six-month extension of the current contract). Allyn Reilly moved and Alex Buckley seconded that we contact The Rev. Lynn Carter-Edmands to ask The Rev. Jason Leo to act as our third party and facilitate the process. All approved.

Vestry Secretary: As per the by-laws the vestry must nominate a current vestry member as secretary to include on the slate presented at the annual meeting. Alex Buckley volunteered and was nominated to be Vestry Secretary.

Budget: So far this year the parish has 38 pledges totaling \$94,000 versus \$119.000 pledged last year. Therefore we need to figure out how to make do with approximately \$20,000 less than we had initially budgeted for this year. Better

news is that it appears our overall expenditures for this past year will be close to what was budgeted.

Organ: The Black family has starting contributing to the organ restoration fund, and we are able to jump start the restoration project. The fund has been renamed the June M. Black and Jan Black Mortensen Fund.

Nicole Siemental recital at Galbreath Chapel (January 30)

Please join us for a recital at Galbreath Chapel on **Tuesday**, **January 30 at 7:30 p.m.** by Nicole Siemental, currently the Assistant Director of Music and Principal Organist at Saint Joseph Cathedral in Columbus, Ohio. While continuing her formal education, Nicole has held many posts as a church musician and university accompanist across the country. Nicole also maintains an active performing career. In 2015, Ms. Simental played in a "Rising Stars" concert at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Indianapolis. In 2016 she won the Immanuel Lutheran Organ Scholar Award and she was the co-winner at the First Sursa American Organ Competition at Ball State University. Additionally, she was a semifinalist for the National Young Artists Competition in Organ Performance. Most recently, in September of 2016 she was awarded 1st prize and a Diploma for the best performance of the



obligatory piece at the IV International Goedicke Organ Competition at the Moscow Conservatory in Moscow, Russia.

Her program at Galbreath will include works by David Briggs, Sweelinck, Bach, Widor, Mendelssohn, Calvin Hampton and Vierne.
