Gospel

Seventeenth Sunday after Pentecost

Matthew 21:23-32



When Jesus entered the temple, the chief priests and the elders of the people came to him as he was teaching, and said, "By what authority are you doing these things, and who gave you this authority?" Jesus said to them, "I will also ask you one question; if you tell me the answer, then I will also tell you by what authority I do these things. Did the baptism of John come from heaven, or was it of human origin?" And they argued with one another, "If we say, 'From heaven,' he will say to us, 'Why then did you not believe him?' But if we say, 'Of human origin,' we are afraid of the crowd; for all regard John as a prophet." So they answered Jesus, "We do not know." And he said to

them, "Neither will I tell you by what authority I am doing these things.

"What do you think? A man had two sons; he went to the first and said, 'Son, go and work in the vineyard today.' He answered, 'I will not'; but later he changed his mind and went. The father went to the second and said the same; and he answered, 'I go, sir'; but he did not go. Which of the two did the will of his father?" They said, "The first." Jesus said to them, "Truly I tell you, the tax collectors and the prostitutes are going into the kingdom of God ahead of you. For John came to you in the way of righteousness and you did not believe him, but the tax collectors and the prostitutes believed him; and even after you saw it, you did not change your minds and believe him.

NAMI Athens Speaker Series at The Athens Public Library, September 28, 2017, 6:30 - 8:00 p.m.

An OSU Master's candidate in Public Health and a writer/communications specialist at NAMI Ohio, Rachel Gearinger has experienced panic attacks since early in her undergraduate career. One of the anxiety disorders, panic disorder is typified by recurrent uncontrollable panic attacks that can cause those afflicted to shake, pass out, have symptoms similar to those of a heart attack, and, in Ms.

Gearinger's case, even suffer from depersonalization and derealization (feeling out of the body), etc. In addition to defining and discussing her experiences with panic

disorder, Ms. Gearinger will tell how she combats and lives with her disorder.


Recital (Oct 14)

Pin-Heui and Louisa will perform an eclectic mixture of songs including Grandos, Debussy, Wolf, and two musical theater pieces!




Save These Dates

A letter from the House of Bishops meeting

This Week's Diocese *e-connections* features a report from Bishop Tom Breidenthal regarding a meeting in Fairbanks, Alaska. The bishop's report is incredibly descriptive and reflective, and it calls us to action well. He writes, "Why are we here? Presiding Bishop Michael Curry wanted us bishops to get a first-hand look at a diocese that has been shaped by the challenges and blessings of racial and ethnic reconciliation. The Diocese of Alaska comprises the entire state-a vast area which is largely, though sparsely, populated by indigenous peoples who have lived off its land for thousands of years. Many of them are Episcopalian, owing to the early work of missionaries like Bishop Gordon, the famous 'flying bishop,' who from the Forties to the Seventies piloted his plane to remote villages all over Alaska, providing food, medicine, access to medical care, advocacy and, above all, recognition and respect for the rich cultural heritage of the native communities. The hope was that our immersion in the history and present struggles of this diocese would help us reflect together on the challenges and blessings of diversity back home." - 4) I will relay your dedication so that it appears in the e-news and bulletin.
